Key achievements to date	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
 Specialist coaches have enriched the programme of PE and Sport, particularly in rugby and multi-skills. Specialist coaches have supported participation in PE and Sport at lunchtime. A number of school events have raised the profile of PE and Sport in the school and raised funds for charity. PE lessons were offered online as part of the school's Remote Education strategy and were enriched by an online virtual sports day. A successful sports week was held on return to school in the summer term 2021. This included workshops run by London Irish Rugby, Barnet Football Club, Kenton Tennis Club and a local Bollywood dancer. Funding was prioritised and redirected to purchasing resources for PE and Sport and to develop children's physical development in EYFS in the summer term in order that spending on resources could be reduced in the academic year 2021-22 when the focus will be on learning and teaching, staff expertise and pupil participation (the areas that were more challenging to develop during the period of Covid-19).
